Noun phrases	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To identify an expanded noun phrase within a sentence
Modal verbs and subjunctive mood	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand what the subjunctive form is and how it can be used within a sentence. Use modal verbs or adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility.
Suffixes – nouns and adjectives to verbs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To make a verb by adding the suffix -ate, -ise or -ify.
Relative clauses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when and that or with an implied relative pronoun.
Commas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use commas to clarify meaning or avoid ambiguity in writing.
Pronouns and possessive pronouns	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To identify pronouns and possessive pronouns within a sentence.
Adverbs to show frequency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify adverbs to show frequency.

Prefixes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create verbs using the prefixes dis-, de-, mis-, over- and re-.
Colons in lists	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use colons, semi-colons and dashes to mark independent clauses.
Subordinating conjunctions and clauses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To use I SAW A WABUB to identify subordinating conjunctions.
