## **Prior Learning**

This unit will build on the knowledge and skills learned in KS1 and those from the autumn term.

Prior learning will be knowledge of how different genres of writing are similar and different to each other and how to recognise and identify the different styles of writing. The children will be expected to write in more complex sentences, thinking about using a variety of sentence openers but focusing particularly on conjunctions which will be scaffolded and modelled. They will also be continuing to punctuate their writing correctly with capital letters, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks and list commas, progressing onto clause commas.
