Who are the key religious figures for Christianity and other faiths?	Look at key religious figures and think about why they make a good leader. Make links between the teaching of Jesus. Write a job spec for a faith founder			
What did they teach their followers to believe and to do? Where do we find these teachings?	Explore the meaning of a parable Jesus taught. Sort key beliefs and teachings by faith and by founder; talk about the similarities.			
What did those figures do in their lives? How did people respond to their deeds and words?	Create a depiction of a faith founder in the style of a famous artist			

How does a person's faith influence the way they live?	Look at the impact of faith teaching on the world today.
How do the teachings of a faith founder impact on wider society?	Recognise key events in the lives of some faith founders and the impact they made

- the founders of Christianity and other faiths and the ways they inspired people to follow them
- the life of Jesus and his teaching

What happened in the Garden of Gethsemane?	Read the Bible story based on the Garden of Gethsemane.			
What is meant by betrayal and denial?	Talk about the two words and think about when we may have betrayed someone in our life.			
What is the 'good news' of Easter for everyone?	Children to complete work based on the Easter Story, with a focus on the good news.
