Nouns	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to identify a noun. To know the difference between a proper noun and a common noun.
Adjectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to identify an adjective. To understand how to use adjectives to create an expanded noun phrase.
Verbs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to identify a verb To be able to recognise auxiliary and modal verbs.
Question and exclamation marks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To confidently independently use question marks and exclamation marks accurately. To understand and identify statements, commands, questions and exclamations.
Tenses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to recognise the past, present and future tense.
Adverbs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To be able to identify adverbs. To understand that adverbs can be used in a variety of places in a sentence.
Conjunctions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To understand how using conjunctions create a compound sentence. To know how to create a complex sentence by starting the sentence with a conjunction.
